

Project Renewal helps New Yorkers break the cycle of homelessness through innovative housing, comprehensive health care, and robust employment programs. In 2024 we served nearly 8,000 people, helping them reach their goals for stability and wellbeing.



Almost 4,000 people sleep in a Project Renewal bed each night 2387 in specialized shelters

273 in transitional housing

941 in permanent housing



of individuals who moved into their **own homes** stayed out of the shelter system for **at least one year**



6,320 people

received **medical care, substance use disorder treatment**, or **psychiatric services** through Project Renewal health programs

2,352 people participated in Occupational Therapy (OT) programs, building everyday skills for living independently while thriving in their communities

More than 85%

of HOPE (Helping Older People Engage) clients are frequent program participants, engaging with an OT program 3 or more times per month

Nearly 70%

of patients returned to see their Project Renewal healthcare provider at least **2 times**, averaging **4.3 visits per year** to our mobile and shelter-based clinics





To help keep their peers and community members safe, **1,783 individuals** received **Narcan training** to reverse an overdose
